Frequently Asked Questions

Q: What is the district meeting?

A: Each month we (that's you, too) meet to discuss and vote on decisions affecting A.A. in our district as well as our area. We share ideas and experiences to ensure AA is there for the next alcoholic. Each home group in Johnstown should send a representative (GSR) to the district meeting to carry that groups input to district, and to report back to the home group afterwards. Get involved in service! To learn more ask your sponsor, a district officer, ask at a meeting, or just come to our next district meeting - all AA members are welcome!

Q: I help out at my home group already, how can I get involved at the district level?

A: There are ALWAYS service opportunities available, no matter how long you've been sober, or how much time you are willing to invest. Want to bring a meeting into a treatment facility? Want to help organize an AA event? Have some books to donate? Want to simply learn more about all this? Talk to any of the coordinators or district officers listed to the left and they can point you in the right direction!

Q: What's the difference between an Area and a District? Where am I?

A: The US and Canada are split into 93 areas - Johnstown is part of Area 60 of PA, which is western half of PA. Each area is split into districts; Area 60 is made up of 45 districts. Johnstown and all of the AA members and groups there make up District 41 of Area 60. A district elects someone to represent them at the area level (called a DCM), and an area elects someone (called a Delegate) to represent them at the US/Canada General Service Conference annually. You are in Johnstown, which is District 41 within Area 60. To learn more check out the AA Service Manual, the WPAArea60.org website, or just ask!
