Election Guidelines

How long are the commitments?

Each position is held for 2 years. There are no strict sobriety time requirements for any position, however there are guidelines outlined below.

How does the election work?

Each position will be described by the person currently holding it, then the floor will be opened for questions related to those duties. At that time it will be asked if anyone is willing to stand for the position.

Who can stand for a position?

Any AA member may stand for the position. When standing, you will be asked to briefly outline why you would like the position. After all standing nominees have finished speaking, all nominees should leave the room and allow the district body to discuss and vote.

Who can vote?

Voting members, per the District 41 guidelines: Shall be the current GSR or the Alternate GSR if the current GSR is absent, so that each group has one vote. All District 41 officers and standing chairs, with a maximum of one vote per voting member.
